- 5. Hamilton Police Services Update Sgt. Cory Gurman Sgt. Gurman began by discussing the number of reported incidents across the months of July and August, and once again reinforced that their data includes Jackson Square, which is not within the Downtown Hamilton BIA's boundary. Then proceeded to discuss new updates to police response within the downtown core, including the upcoming increase in the number of core patrol officers and how this will reflect in more officers on the ground during the day.
