19 and 21 John St. North

21 John Street North was the site of a series of tinsmiths throughout the 19th century including a facility for the Copp Brothers in the 1860s, Spencer & Sweeney tin and copper smiths in the 1870s, and Wallace & Sons in the 1880s. The building, originally two storeys in height, became a three-storey brick building with a one-storey rear brick wing by the late 1890s. In the early-20th century 19 and 21 John Street North housed Robinson & Company undertakers. Since the mid-20th century, 21 John Street North has housed a series of restaurants, including Bambu which currently occupies the space, and 19 John Street houses Downtown Bike Hounds.
