Kresge's

43 King Street East is a two-storey brick commercial building constructed in 1930 with Art Deco influences constructed for S.S. Kresge Company Limited on the site of the former 19thcentury Clyde Block, which housed Murray & Sons Limited Dry Goods in the early-20th century. The building has a rectangular plan with a short façade, a flat roof and a plain parapet topped with pre-cast concrete.

In 1977, the Kresge Corporation changed its name to Kmart and the King Street East Kresge location closed on April 27, 1994 after 64 years of business. In 2012, 43 King Street East housed Delta Bingo, which moved into the building in 1998 after relocating from their previous location at the King and Main Street, where they had been located for approximately 20 years. This sight is now the location of the future Cobalt Luxury Residences On King buildings.
