22 POP projects were implemented in 2021 in Central Division. POP – Project Safeguard was implemented from October 8<sup>th</sup> to December 5<sup>th</sup> to address community stakeholder concerns in the area around the YWCA. Project was extended to December 31<sup>st</sup> due to the relocation of the CTS

Mission: The Downtown Hamilton BIA provides value to our members through advocacy, beautification, promotion, development and preservation of Downtown Hamilton.
